**50** How many stars are on the U.S. flag?

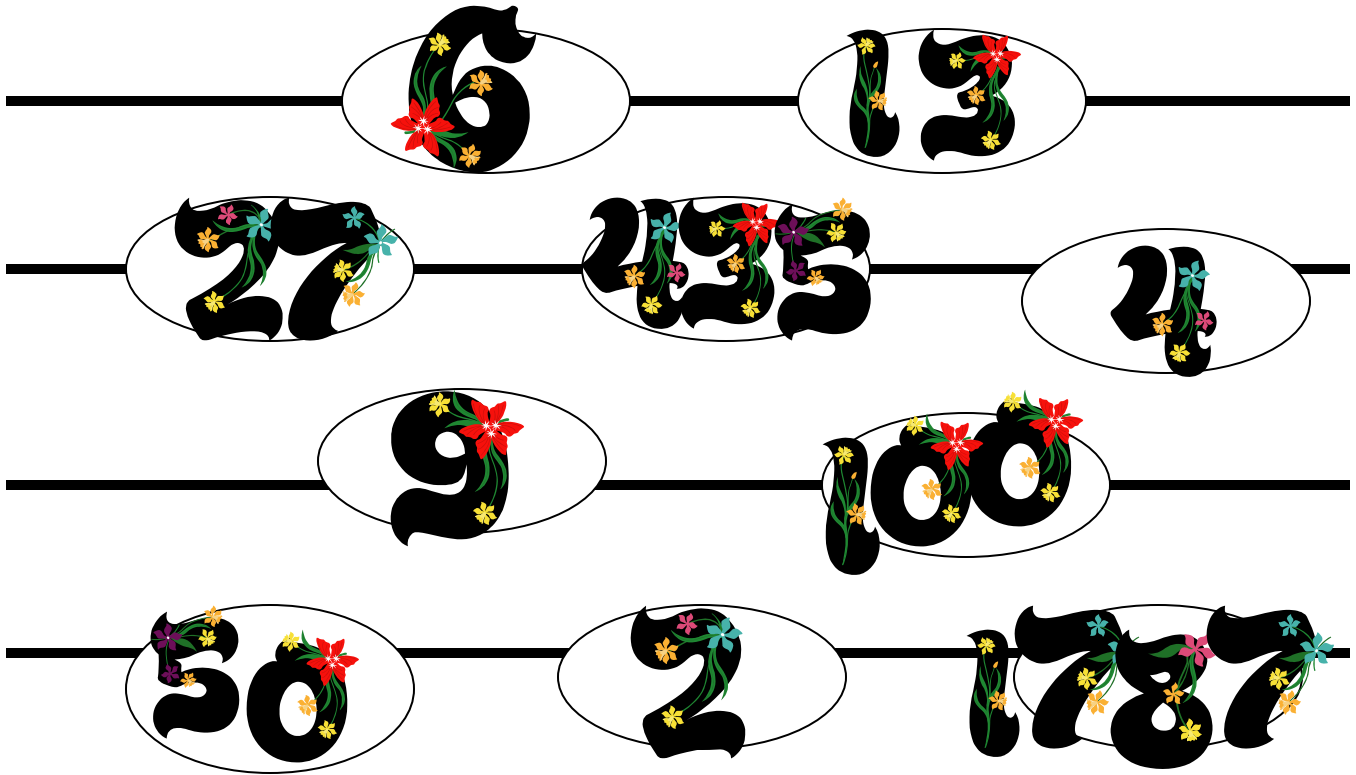
**435** The House of Representatives has how many voting members?
