

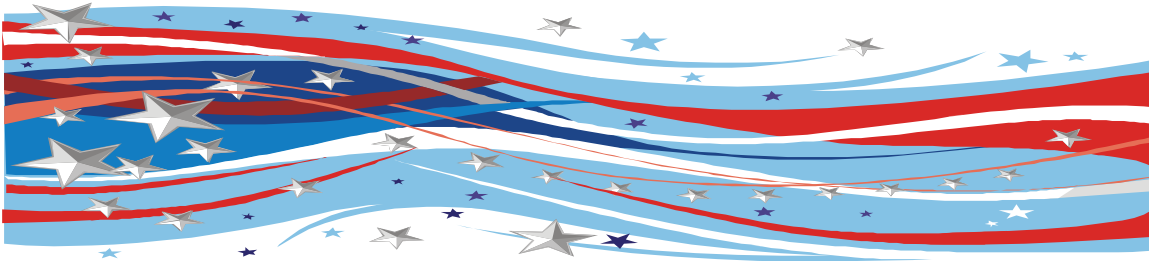
Crossword

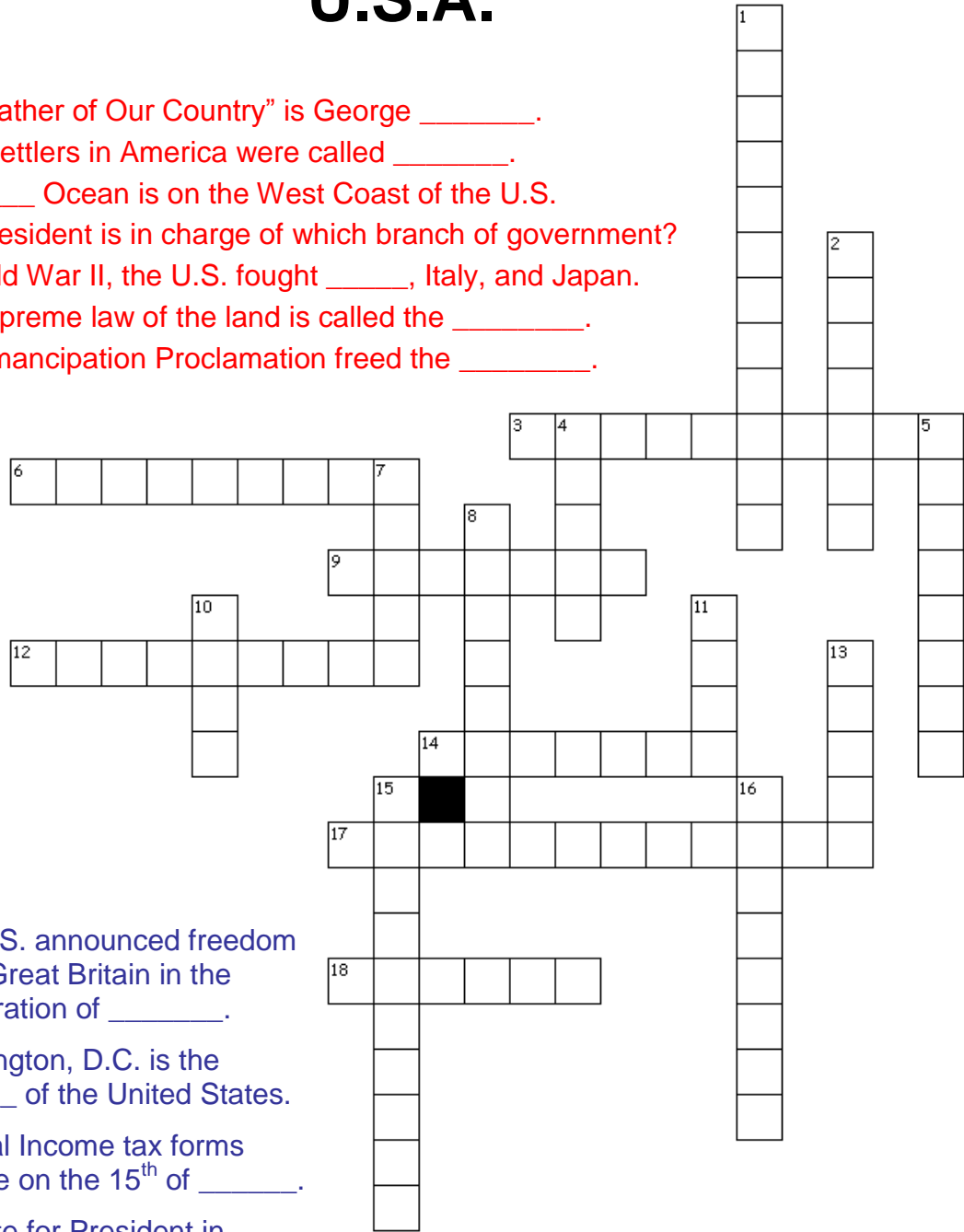
