Prevention Strategies

You can do three things to help prevent the main causes of death in North Carolina. You can exercise, eat right, and avoid smoking. Your tribe must avoid smoking to survive. As always, your survival tools are education and action.

Your challenge is to explore the effects of secondhand smoke and decide whether smoking in public places should be allowed.

Survival Plan: Do You Mind if I Smoke?

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Background Information

Level: My class is a mix of intermediate and low-intermediate

students. An instructor can adjust this project

satisfactorily for other levels of English competence.

Objective: Students will express and defend their opinions about

smoking in public buildings both before and after they

explore the danger of secondhand smoke.

Time: My class meets Monday through Thursday, for four hours

a day. For a little over two weeks, we used approximately two hours per class on this challenge for a total of about

fifteen hours.

Overview: First, I had my students respond in writing to opinion

questions about smoking in public buildings. The

students wrote their sentences on paper and then on the

board so others could see/share their responses.

Next, I had the class stage a debate.

After the debate the class heard a guest speaker talk about secondhand smoke.

We subsequently discussed what the speaker told us, and then I had the class answer the same questions again to see if there were any changes in their opinions.

Education and Action

Day One

I used the following questions to get my students started on this challenge:

- Do you think your workplace (or your school) should be smoke free? Why or why not?
- Do you think restaurants should be smoke free? Why or why not?
- Do you think your child's school should be smoke free?
 Why or why not?
- Should landlords be able to restrict apartments to smoke-free? Why or why not?
- Do you think a hospital should be smoke free? Why or why not?
- Do you think it is OK to smoke in a car? Why or why not?

Before they began answering the questions, we talked about some of the vocabulary:

- 1. Workplace
- 2. Smoke Free
- 3. Restaurants
- 4. Landlord
- 5. Restrict
- 6. Apartments

I had the students write a sentence with each vocabulary word, and then I gave them a spelling quiz using these new words.



Day Two

I gave a handout titled "Do You Smoke" to each student. (A copy is included at the end of this project plan.) I gave students about 30 minutes to complete this exercise. I was able to walk around the room while they wrote and give help if they needed it.



After everyone finished I had each student to come to the board and write one of their sentences. After they wrote on the board they had to read the question and read their answer to the rest of the class.

Day Three

This is the day we first answered the opinion questions given out on Day One. I gave the students about: 45 minutes to answer these questions on paper. Again, I had them put their answers on the



board for the whole class to see/share. We talked about the differences in their opinions.

Day Four

I divided the class into two groups. Group one had answered, "yes" to most of the questions and group two had answered, "no" to most of the questions.

I put the students in rows and let them defend their opinions. This was done like a debate. They debated for about 30 minutes.



The rules were that only one person on one team could speak at a time. After all had spoken, I decided the winners, using the criteria of who quoted the most resources and who used the most vocabulary words. There were many winners!



Day Five


A health care professional from our Respiratory Care program came in to give a presentation on the effects of secondhand smoke. His presentation lasted about 45 minutes and the class had many questions for him.

Day Six

The next class we talked about the information our guest speaker had presented.

Then I had each student answer the original questions again, in writing.

We discussed whether and why any of their answers changed after they heard about the effects of secondhand smoke.






- 1. Do you think your work place or school should be smoke free? Yes because it is good to not smoke and makes everyone get healthier.
